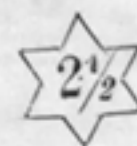




# THE READING RAILROAD AND ITS PRESIDENT.
